Year 7 Catch Up

OHA in previous year have received an additional £500 in funding for each pupil in Year 7 who did not achieve at least level 4 in reading and/or Mathematics at the end of KS2.

This academic year the criteria for funding is now based on percentage of students in the previous year group who were "Catchup" and we received £10,162.

The 2016 cohort shows a decreasing trend in Catch-up students arriving at the academy.

2016-17 Year 7 'Catch-up' students:

The KS2 NC levels have gone and have been replaced with a scaled score. The National Expected Standard score is 100 for Reading & Mathematics.

Reading:

- 39% of Year 7 students have a KS2 Score in Reading below 100 (4b)
- 8% of Year 7 students have a KS2 Score in Reading below 90 (3b)

Mathematics:

- 43% of Year 7 students have a KS2 Score in Mathematics below 100 (4b)
- 7% of Year 7 students have a KS2 Score in Mathematics below 90 (3b)
