It has been 'Accelerated Reader Rewards Week' here at Ormiston Horizon Academy this week. To celebrate the students' reading achievements, there have been lots of initiatives launched to reward these students for their efforts and progress in the reading programme. On Tuesday 2nd and Wednesday 3rd July, Miss Gardner, the Director of Literacy, led AR rewards assemblies for Year 7 and Year 8 in which students received certificates and prizes, including a Kindle Fire; our top 20 readers were invited to a 'Summer Tales & Teapots' event which was held on Tuesday afternoon, in which students took part in a book quiz whilst indulging in some beautifully delicious summer-themed cakes prepared by the catering team; Draco was the overall winning house for Y7 and Pegasus was the overall winning house for Y8 for reading the most number of words this year - these students were invited to rewards breakfast which took place on Thursday/Friday morning. Guest Speaker

This week Year 7 and 8 were privileged to have a guest speaker: Charlie from the charity 'More Than a Face' delivered an assembly and workshops to help share and raise awareness about facial disfigurements. Charlie's own son, Harry, was born with a rare cranio-facial condition called 'Goldenhar Syndrome' which means that his left eye, eye socket, ear and nostril never developed. His twin brother was unaffected by the syndrome. He was also diagnosed, aged 3, with autism and he is technically non-verbal. More Than a Face was founded by Charlene to educate and inspire people who may never have met someone with a facial disfigurement before and to help them realise the consequences of their reactions, both positive and negative. She hopes that her positive message of understanding and inclusion will help to change attitudes and behaviour and that people will realise the power in seeing each other for who they are and not just what they look like. Charlie's message was received very well from both year groups and staff during her assembly and some individualised workshops.

As we approach the last few days of term, I would like to take a moment to reflect and recognise some of the amazing activities that have taken place over recent weeks.


